Dear Sir or Madam:

The following information is being provided in response to your recent inquiry concerning the 2000 *A Guide to HMDA Reporting: Getting It Right!* Since there were no major changes to Regulation C, the Staff Commentary, the HMDA file specifications or edits for 2000, it is unnecessary to complete a 2000 version of the Guide. The 1998 Guide should be used for guidance on collection and reporting of calendar year 2000 HMDA data due March 1, 2001.

This notice also serves as a reminder of previously announced information that relates to reporting requirements for 2000, including the exemption threshold for depository and nondepository institutions, the designation by the Office of Management and Budget of two new Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) and a county code change:

- Exemption threshold: Depository institutions with assets of \$30 million or less as of 12/31/1999 are exempt for 2000 data collection. Nondepository institutions are exempt if they have assets (when combined with the assets of any parent corporation) of \$10 million or less as of 12/31/1999 and originated fewer than 100 home purchase loans (including refinancings) in 1999.

- New MSAs:

Auburn-Opelika, Alabama has been designated as MSA 0580, consisting of Lee County, code 081.

Corvallis, Oregon has been designated as MSA 1890, consisting of Benton County, code 003.

- County Code Change: The county code for Miami-Dade County, Florida, formerly known as Dade County, will change from 025 to 086.
