**TO: Individuals Responsible for Preparing the FFIEC 002, FFIEC 002S, and FFIEC 019 Reports**

We are writing to make individuals responsible for preparing the:

- Report of Assets and Liabilities of U.S. Branches and Agencies of Foreign Banks (FFIEC 002);
- Report of Assets and Liabilities of a Non-U.S. Branch that is Managed or Controlled by a U.S. Branch or Agency of a Foreign (Non-U.S.) Bank (FFIEC 002S); and
- Country Exposure Report for U.S. Branches and Agencies of Foreign Banks (FFIEC 019)


aware that these reports are migrating to a new reporting application, Reporting Central, which is replacing the Internet Electronic Submission (IESUB) application. For institutions that do not choose to file one or more of these reports electronically, the Federal Reserve will continue to accept paper copy submissions of these reports.

The Federal Reserve developed Reporting Central to enhance the overall reporting functionality of the Federal Reserve Banks' data collection and processing activities. These enhancements will allow for a more secure, technically advanced, and efficient system that will encompass a single point of entry for electronic submission and file uploads. Financial and nonfinancial institutions will access Reporting Central via the FedLine® Web access solution to submit reports and gain access to electronic reporting applications, report forms, and instructions.

Implementation of Reporting Central will be a phased transition for these FFIEC reports. The FFIEC 019 report will move to this new application as of the March 31, 2014, report date. The FFIEC 002 and FFIEC 002S will migrate to Reporting Central as of the June 30, 2014, report date.
